



This mailer provides information about open burning regulations affecting you, your neighbors or smoke sensitive individuals living in your area.

Did you know? It is illegal to burn these materials in an outdoor fire anywhere in Polk County.

ALLOWED materials (Unincorporated Polk County, Iowa) Landscape waste originating on your property: yard waste, grass clippings, leaves, twigs, small branches, etc. Burning of hauled-in landscape waste is prohibited. The material must originate or grow on your own property.

<u>Regulatory Notice:</u> Currently open burning is allowed by regulation in unincorporated Polk County. <u>However</u>, open burning may be restricted if a <u>public</u> nuisance is created by the <u>unreasonable</u> or <u>excessive</u> open burning activities.

- Under Polk County regulations & lowa Code the open burning of certain materials is illegal and subject to penalties.
- PCBOH Chapter V, Section 5-7 prohibits open burning of any hazardous waste, animal waste, animal bedding materials, oils, any household waste, garbage, refuse, plastics, construction materials, tires, wire, insulation, dimensional lumber within Polk County.
- Violations may result in legal action including fines of \$100-\$500.
