Polk County Residents

Polk County residents will have the opportunity to exchange their gasoline powered lawn mower for an environmentally friendly, zero-emission producing, light weight, easy to operate, Black & Decker self propelled electric mower through a special arrangement between the Polk County Public Works Department, Midwest Recovery and Black & Decker®.

The cost after exchange is \$285. Normally these mowers retail for \$450.

Supplies are limited to fifty (50) exchanges.

Why are we asking you to exchange your gas mower?

The Polk County Public Works Department Air Quality Division (AQD), in conjunction with, residents, Midwest Recovery and Black & Decker® are working to reduce the amount of ground-level ozone and fine particulate matter air pollution in our county. Polk County residents can voluntarily exchange their gasoline lawn mower for a more efficient cordless electric mower. This effort will help all Polk County residents breathe cleaner air by reducing emissions of hazardous air pollutants (HAPs) and volatile organic compounds (VOC) that may affect homeowners, their families, their neighbors, and the community.



The mower exchange is easy and convenient!

It's a simple one stop process.

1. **Beginning April 1, 2014-** Deliver your operational gas powered lawn mower to:

Polk County Public Works Department, located at 5885 NE 14th Street, Des Moines (Business Hours: 7AM-5PM, M-F).

Bring your photo ID.

At the time of exchange, pay \$285 in check, cash or credit card for an electric Black & Decker® (36V) 19" Self-Propelled Rechargeable Mower - Model#SPCM1936.

Who is Qualified to participate in this program?

- Once relinquished, all traded mowers become property of Midwest Recovery
