- Excessive rainfall occurred on the evening of 30JUN causing extensive flash flooding countywide. Widespread rainfall of 3 to 8 inches.
- Flood Warning for Polk County through Sunday evening
- River Flood Warning continue for parts of the Des Moines River.
- River Flood Warnings along Raccoon River.

**Wednesday:** Mostly sunny, with a high near 87.

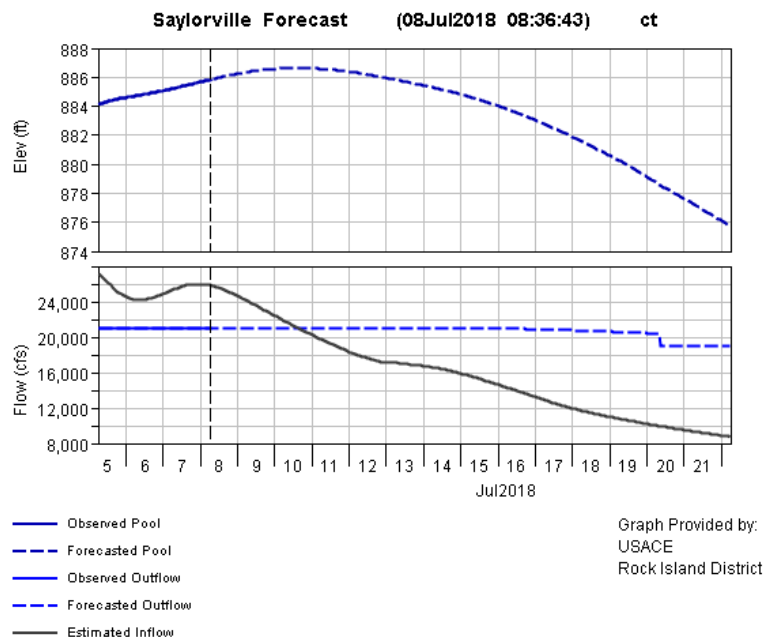

The Polk County Comprehensive Emergency Plan (CEP) is built on 15 core emergency support functions or ESFs.
