July 9 (-120 days) is the first day the election office can accept absentee ballot requests for the November General Election. The ballots will not be available until early October.

<u>Pay Increase</u> <u>Approved</u>

The Polk County Board of Supervisors approved Jamie Fitzgerald, Polk County Auditor and Commissioner of Elections pay increase recommendation for election day poll workers.

Poll workers will now receive **\$10 per hour** for election work and training.

Precinct Captains pay will change from \$200 per election to an hourly rate of **\$14** for both election work and training.

Thank you Auditor Fitzgerald for requesting the additional pay.

We have changed a step to the close polls procedure. You will now select "YES" and print a write in report.. The write in report will go in the tally book and returned to the election office in the brown bag.

General Election

The General Election is November 6, which is just around the corner!

This is a midterm year, so statewide offices (Governor, Attorney General, etc.) will be on the ballot. All representatives in the Iowa House will also be on the ballot along with State Senators in certain districts. At the county level, there will be three Board of Supervisors seats up along with the County Attorney, County Treasurer and County Recorder. All seats in the U.S. House of Representatives are also on the ballot.

2018 General absentee requests for mailed ballots are valid only from July 9– October 27. Absentee ballots will begin mailing on October 8. The worry free voter registration deadline is October 27.
