

PLOTTING A COMEBACK

GROWING, HARVESTING RARE NATIVE PLANTS

Prairies are considered lowa's most complex and diverse habitats, offering food, shelter, water, and space for innumerable wildlife. Today, however, this wide-open landscape makes up less than one percent of lowa's landscape. It's this uniqueness and rarity that compels Polk County

Conservation to actively protect and restore prairies. One of the ways conservation staff does this is through encouraging the growth of hardy plants and flowers that are known to grow locally. But getting access to such rare local seeds can be an expensive endeavor.

Harvesting seed has been identified as one creative solution to the challenge of procuring costly native prairie seed from existing prairies. And in recent years Polk County Conservation has actively planted native prairie plants in production plots for the express

purpose of harvesting even more desirable seed. In 2023 alone, the prairie production plots produced nearly 37 pounds of seed, valued at \$13,398. In addition to the cost savings, the effort gives staff more control over what types of seed they grow and subsequently harvest to fill out its needed inventory.

The prairie seed production plots are located at Chichaqua Bottoms Greenbelt and are jointly managed with the lowa Department of Natural Resources, with the help of many volunteers. The success of the effort is spurring the two organizations to double the capacity of the plots in 2024 and grow up to six additional species of prairie plants.

Athene North Shore Recreation Area Opens for Summer

Connection. This is what the Athene
North Shore Recreation Area at
Easter Lake Park is built to inspire
in all who visit the new waterfront
park this summer. Opening in May
2024, Athene North Shore is

a place where you can achieve something monumental or simply make a special memory. It's a place the entire community can connect with one another and the natural world.

When the park officially opens, you'll see a space perfectly designed to draw people together. All children will mingle together for imaginative play in the natural playscape and spray ground. Paddlers of all skill level and ability will paddle the lake together in adaptive or standard kayaks. Whether on two-wheels or two feet. anglers of all stipes — or should we say scales? — will fish side-by-side on the accessible docks or pontoon boat. Even the list of summer programs will feature topics and teachers that bridge the gaps in both interest and ability.

"There are a few things that the staff at Athene North Shore are very focused on. The first is creating the most welcoming, usable space for all people," said Devon Boes, Community Outreach and Program Coordinator. "The other, equally important, is safety – both physical and emotional. And I see these two elements going hand-in-hand. When we create a safe space for everyone, then park users immediately feel it, and know they are surrounded with

the support they need to try something new, recreate in a way they never thought possible."

In addition to the critical built environment and equipment that create safe spaces at Athene North Shore, the staff are all trained to facilitate safe recreation and education

opportunities. In addition to first aid and CPR, staff on-site are also trained to assist with safe transfers in and out of recreation equipment, as well as adapt programs to serve a wide range of people for maximum inclusion.

This commitment by staff to build such a safe space is underpinned by



the dedication of community leaders. Athene North Shore is the achieved vision of a group of change-makers who wanted to create a natural space where everyone could enjoy carefree outdoor recreation together. The collective effort by community leaders, designers, accessibility specialists and staff have created a recreation destination that is built upon an all-encompassing welcome, as much as it is dirt and concrete footings.

2024 **Bond Updates**

SCOD Stewards

As part of Conservation's promise of transparency to the voters, this space in Nature News is dedicated to providing updates on projects — large and small — that are funded with Polk County Water and Land Legacy bond dollars.



ICON Water Trail Site

Conservation invested \$1.5 million toward the design of its future ICON water trails site in downtown Des Moines. Initial plans include fish habitat and ripple features for kayaking. The water trail park will sit along the Raccoon River just to the east of the Fleur Drive.



New Playgrounds

Colorful and full of nature themes, there are two new playgrounds at Easter Lake Park and one new playground at Thomas Mitchell Park. These are exciting attractions for kids with slides, climbing gyms, and merry-go-rounds ready for play in summer 2024.



Trails End Wildlife Seeding

Construction is nearly complete on the wetlands within this expansive wildlife area. Next up, staff have planted more than \$80 thousand in native prairie plants. This flora will play a vital role in creating wildlife habitat and support natural filtration of the wetland water.



Alleman Park

Conservation purchased more than 40 acres in the community of Alleman. The land is situated along Fourmile Creek, which will allow staff to continue its restoration work along this flood-prone waterway, as well as promote recreation as the town's first and only public park.

Septic Tank Updates

Conservation's construction team recently learned that some of the underground septic tanks in the parks were reaching their expiration dates. Dollars are now committed to replacing the tanks and creating a long-term maintenance and replacement schedule.




