ORDINANCE NO.	

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NOS. 327 AND 339. PROVIDING THAT GENERAL PROPERTY TAXES LEVIED AND COLLECTED EACH YEAR ON CERTAIN PROPERTY LOCATED WITHIN THE WHITETAIL RIDGE RESIDENTIAL URBAN RENEWAL AREA, IN POLK COUNTY, STATE OF IOWA, BY AND FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE STATE OF IOWA, POLK COUNTY, POLK CITY, NORTH POLK COMMUNITY SCHOOL DISTRICT, AND OTHER TAXING DISTRICTS, BE PAID TO A SPECIAL FUND FOR PAYMENT OF PRINCIPAL AND INTEREST ON LOANS, MONIES ADVANCED TO AND INDEBTEDNESS, INCLUDING BONDS ISSUED OR TO BE ISSUED, INCURRED BY THE COUNTY IN CONNECTION WITH THE WHITETAIL RIDGE RESIDENTIAL URBAN RENEWAL AREA (BCV PLAT 1 AND PLAT 2 PARCELS)

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Polk County, State of Iowa, has heretofore, in Ordinance No. 327, as amended by Ordinance No. 339, provided for the division of taxes on the Phase 1 Property within the Whitetail Ridge Residential Urban Renewal Area ("Area" or "Urban Renewal Area"), pursuant to Section 403.19, Code of Iowa; and

WHEREAS, the County desires to add additional parcels currently within the Area to the division of revenue pursuant to Section 403.19, Code of Iowa, through the adoption of this Ordinance, which additional parcels are legally described herein and referred to as the "BCV Plat 1 and Plat 2 Parcels" [Note: The Phase 1 Property and the Plat 1 and Plat 2 Parcels are the only portions of the Urban Renewal Area that are included in the TIF Ordinance at this time. If other parcels in the Area develop (increase in value) in the future, the County may add other parcels/subareas within the Urban Renewal Area to the TIF Ordinance. Therefore, various parcels or subareas in this Urban Renewal Area will have different frozen bases and different expiration dates.]; and

WHEREAS, indebtedness has been incurred by the County, and additional indebtedness is anticipated to be incurred in the future, to finance urban renewal project activities within the Urban Renewal Area, and the continuing needs of redevelopment within the Urban Renewal Area are such as to require the continued application of the incremental tax resources of the Urban Renewal Area; and

WHEREAS, the following enactment is necessary to accomplish the objectives described in the premises.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF POLK COUNTY, STATE OF IOWA, THAT:

Ordinance Numbers 327 and 339 are hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 1. For purposes of this Ordinance, the following terms shall have the following meanings:

(a) Phase 1 Property means that portion of Polk County, Iowa described in the Urban Renewal Plan for the Whitetail Ridge Residential Urban Renewal Area and included under Ordinance Nos. 327 and 339, which Phase 1 Property includes the lots and parcels located within the area legally described as follows:

Lots 1-8 of Whitetail Ridge Plat 1

and

Lots 1-6 and Outlots W, X, and Y of Whitetail Ridge Plat 2

(b) <u>BCV Plat 1 and Plat 2 Parcels</u> means that portion of Polk County, State of Iowa, included within the Whitetail Ridge Residential Urban Renewal Area and legally described as follows:

Phase 1 of Big Creek Valley, the Property that will be platted as Lots 1-13 and 44-65 of Big Creek Valley Plat 1, which is legally described as follows;

A PORTION OF OUTLOT 'F' AND PARCEL 'C' OF LOT 1 IN TOURNAMENT CLUB OF IOWA PLAT 1 AN OFFICIAL PLAT, ALL NOW INCLUDED IN AND FORMING A PART OF THE CITY OF POLK CITY, POLK COUNTY, IOWA MORE PARTICULARLY DESCRIBED AS FOLLOWS:

BEGINNING AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF THE PORTION OF SAID OUTLOT 'F' ADJACENT TO NW HUGG DRIVE;

OUTLOT 'Z' IN BIG CREEK VALLEY PLAT 1, AN OFFICIAL PLAT, ALL NOW INCLUDED IN AND FORMING A PART OF THE CITY OF POLK CITY, POLK COUNTY, IOWA

(c) <u>Amended Area</u> means that portion of Polk County, State of Iowa, included within the Whitetail Ridge Residential Urban Renewal Area and described in subsections (a)-(b).

Section 2. The taxes levied on the taxable property in the Amended Area, legally described in Section 1 hereof, by and for the benefit of the State of Iowa, Polk County, Polk City, North Polk Community School District, and all other taxing districts from and after the effective date of this Ordinance shall be divided as hereinafter in this Ordinance provided.

Section 3. As to the Phase 1 Property, that portion of the taxes which would be produced by the rate at which the tax is levied each year by or for each of the taxing districts taxing property in the Phase 1 Property upon the total sum of the assessed value of the taxable property in the Phase 1 Property as shown on the assessment roll as of January 1, 2017, being the first day of the calendar year preceding the calendar year in which the County first certified to the Auditor an amount of loans, advances, indebtedness or bonds payable from the division of property tax revenue under Iowa Code Section 403.19. The taxes so determined shall be referred herein as the "base period taxes" for such Phase 1 Property.

As to the BCV Plat 1 and Plat 2 Parcels of the Whitetail Ridge Residential Urban Renewal Area, base period taxes shall be computed in the same manner using the total assessed value shown on the assessment roll as of January 1, 2020, being the assessment roll applicable to the property in such area as of January 1 of the calendar year preceding the effect date of this Ordinance.

Section 4. That portion of the taxes each year in excess of the base period taxes for the Amended Area, determined for each subarea thereof as provided in Section 3 of this Ordinance, shall be allocated to and when collected be paid into the special tax increment fund previously established by Polk County, State of Iowa, to pay the principal of and interest on loans, monies advanced to, or indebtedness, whether funded, refunded, assumed or otherwise, including bonds issued under authority of Section 403.9 or Section 403.12 of the Code of Iowa, incurred by Polk County, State of Iowa, to finance or refinance, in whole or in part, urban renewal projects undertaken within the Urban Renewal Area pursuant to the Whitetail Ridge Residential Urban Renewal Plan, as amended, except that (i) taxes for the regular and voter-approved physical plant and equipment levy of a school district imposed pursuant to Iowa Code Section 298.2 and taxes for the instructional support program of a school district imposed pursuant to Iowa Code Section 257.19 (but in each case only to the extent required under Iowa Code Section 403.19(2)); (ii) taxes for the payment of bonds and interest of each taxing district; (iii) taxes imposed under Iowa Code Section 346.27(22) related to joint county-city buildings; and (iv) any other exceptions under Iowa

Code Section 403.19 shall be collected against all taxable property within the Amended Area without any limitation as hereinabove provided.

Section 5. Unless or until the total assessed valuation of the taxable property in the subareas of the Amended Area exceeds the total assessed value of the taxable property in the subareas shown by the assessment rolls referred to in Section 3 of this Ordinance, all of the taxes levied and collected upon the taxable property in the Amended Area shall be paid into the funds for the respective taxing districts as taxes by or for the taxing districts in the same manner as all other property taxes.

Section 6. At such time as the loans, monies advanced, bonds and interest thereon and indebtedness of Polk County, State of Iowa, referred to in Section 4 hereof have been paid, all monies thereafter received from taxes upon the taxable property in the Amended Area shall be paid into the funds for the respective taxing districts in the same manner as taxes on all other property.

Section 7. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed. The provisions of this Ordinance are intended and shall be construed so as to continue the division of taxes from property within the Phase 1 Property, under the provisions of Section 403.19 of the Code of Iowa, as originally authorized in Ordinance Nos. 327 and 339, and to fully implement the provisions of Section 403.19 of the Code of Iowa with respect to the division of taxes from property within the BCV Plat 1 and Plat 2 Parcels as described above. Notwithstanding any provisions in any prior Ordinances or other documents, the provisions of this Ordinance and all prior Ordinances relating to the Amended Area (including its subareas) shall be construed to continue the division of taxes from property within the Amended Area to the maximum period of time allowed by Section 403.19 of the Code of Iowa. In the event that any provision of this Ordinance shall be determined to be contrary to law it shall not affect other provisions or application of this Ordinance which shall at all times be construed to fully invoke the provisions of Section 403.19 of the Code of Iowa with reference to the Amended Area and the territory contained therein.

Section 8. This Ordinance shall be in effect after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

Action Requested (Recommended): Application and letter of commitment for the Lead-Based Paint Hazard Control Grant was approved on July 6, 2021.

Comply with Policy: Lead poisoning prevention is a priority for Polk County.

Background: Lead paint, which was banned from residential use in 1978, is the primary source of lead poisoning in Iowa. Two-thirds of Des Moines' housing stock was built before 1978. The US Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) estimates that 35 percent of all housing units in the Midwest have "significant lead-based paint hazards". Polk County began remediating homes with lead-based paint hazards in 2007 and has been awarded three HUD grants since 2009.

Polk County has been awarded its fourth HUD Lead Based Paint Hazard Reduction grant and proposes to remediate lead hazards in 150 units of housing in Polk County between 11/1/2021 and 5/30/2025. This grant allows for funding to assist in the promotion and development of programs to concurrently identify and address multiple housing-related health hazards with lead hazard control interventions. Polk County proposes to conduct Healthy Homes assessments and develop appropriate intervention strategies for up to 60 homes which are eligible for the Lead Hazard Control program. The total amount awarded is \$3,455,000.

A minimum of 10% Matching funds are required for this grant application. Through contributions of in-kind staff time and direct investments towards lead repair work, Polk County will commit \$600,000.

Action Impact: 150 additional housing units in Polk County will receive lead remediation and 60 of these homes will receive additional Healthy Homes assessments and interventions.




